Slippery Rock Borough Office, 306 E. Water Street, Slippery Rock, PA 16057-1170 Council Meeting Minutes for **Tuesday May 11, 2021** from 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm

President Karl called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Mayor Longo led the Council members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Shawn Pugh performed the roll call. Those present: Russ Karl, Ron Steele, Gene Allison, Lauren Christmann, Jeff Campbell, Royce Lorentz, Mayor Jondavid Longo, Solicitor Rebecca Black, Borough Manager Shawn Pugh. Council Person Denton Zeronas was present via ZOOM.

Outside Entity Reports:

Slippery Rock University: Robb King reported that SRU celebrated its Spring 2021 graduates with a two -day series of commencement ceremonies on April 30-May 1. All ceremonies were held at SRU's Mihalik-Thompson Stadium. Each ceremony was livestreamed on www.sru.edu. Robb also announced the hiring of 1988 SRU alum and 2015 Rock Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, Roberta Page as its next director of Intercollegiate Athletics. Robb stated that clinic dates for on campus COVID-19 vaccinations are May 19 & 21. First and second vaccines will be available.

Slippery Rock Community Library: Karen Pierce reported that the library served over 825 patrons in April. The library continues to look for a vendor truck to be present for the library's 16th birthday celebration on June 5, 2021. Karen noted that a SRU intern is working to create opportunities for vocational training for special education students. The library is also hosting an intern from Chatham University who is researching "Green Grants" that will help to reduce the Carbon Footprint for the library. Lastly, Karen reported that in early July, the library will be planting the 300 plants they received in conjunction with the Butler County Conservation District grant.

Slippery Rock Municipal Authority: Shawn Pugh reported on behalf of the SRMA stating that they are continuing to patch the sidewalks on Main Street. The East side is finished, and the West side is expected to be completed in the next few weeks. The MA is preparing the subdivision for the plot of land that their lift station sits on. They will submit it to the Planning Committee when it is complete.

Slippery Rock Parks and Recreation: Mary Messer reported that the park has been busy with the fields being fully utilized. She reported that Summer registration is doing well. The Father/Daughter dance will be held at the football field this Friday May 14, 2021. It will be a bonfire with food, refreshments and music. On May 20, 2021 the High School Musical, "A Musical Review", will be shown. Limited auditorium tickets will be sold. The show will also be live -streamed and tickets can be purchased online through ShowTix4U. Lastly, Mary reported that the pickleball court should be finished and ready for use by June.

Slippery Rock Volunteer Fire Company & Rescue Team: Kurt Reasner reported that they had a busy April with 16 medicals and 25 service alarms. The firehouse had one member graduate from Butler County Fire School this week. There are currently 3 members attending Lawrence County Fire School, they are scheduled to graduate in July. Lastly, The Sportsman Raffle is approaching. The tickets go on sale in June.

Slippery Rock in Bloom: Shawn Pugh reported on SR in Bloom's behalf. Regina Greenwald is searching for volunteers to pull tulips and plant Canna Lilies in the Borough May 29, 2021.

Slippery Rock Development: Shawn Pugh spoke on behalf of the SRD. Shawn stated that the fountain and area are now equipped with lighting. There are pavers and benches that still need to be moved.

Mayor's Comments:

Mayor Jondavid Longo commented that he met with Jack Cohen from Butler County Tourism to determine sites for the 130-150 ft flagpole for the Borough. The Mayor is looking forward to fundraising and moving the proposed project along. The Mayor also congratulated Denton Zeronas on obtaining his degree in education from SRU this Spring.
