Citizen Input:

Jennifer Ravert from 410 Elm Street addressed Council thanking the Borough Manager and the Code Enforcement Officer for their quick response to her complaint regarding storm water on her property. The Borough manager stated that the catch basin was clear and is an appropriate size. The Code Officer sent a letter to the Cooper Street Apartment's owner asking them to not dump yard waste near the creek which dams and diverts the storm water into the Ravert's property.

Council Person's Remarks:

Ron Steele remarked that the garbage cans and overgrown bushes are still a concern at the corner of Grange Alley. Shawn Pugh stated that he will have the Code Enforcement Officer address it tomorrow.

Royce Lorentz remarked that the one-way signs on the street behind Ginger Hill were removed and that some clear markings should be placed there to alert the public that it is a one-way street.
