

Slippery Rock Borough Council Meeting

306 E Water Street Slippery Rock, PA 16057 **Tuesday December 13, 2022** from 7:00 pm to 7:25pm

Denton Zeronas called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Mayor Longo led the Council members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Christian Laskey Performed the Roll Call. Those present: Denton Zeronas, Lauren Christmann, Royce Lorentz, Ron Steele, Borough Solicitor Rebecca Black, Mayor Jondavid Longo, Borough Manager Christian Laskey. Mike Pavelek addressed Council asking that they reconsider approving a burning permit for the Borough. He is wanting debris that may pose a trip or poke hazard in the Passive Park to be burned. He asked that Council discuss it at the next workshop meeting.
