

Slippery Rock Borough Council Meeting 306 East Water Street Slippery Rock, PA 16057 Tuesday January 17, 2023 from 7:00 pm to 7:45 pm

Jeff Campbell called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Mayor Longo led the Council members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Christian Laskey will speak with Peoples Natural Gas to see if that is a possibility. Mayor Longo reported that Boller Drive and Manning Way are in need of repair. He is hoping that the Borough can work with Slippery Rock Township and the school district to fix those roads.

Discussion Items:

Gateway Park Lot Line Revision: (See Attached) Christian Laskey reported the Slippery Rock Borough Planning Commission recommended the lot line revision for the vacant lot to Slippery Rock Borough council for approval. Certain members of the Planning Commission debated having a second survey and appraisal done. This would allow potential buyers to have 2 purchasing options with one option being more expensive but offering more property. After the discussion, Rebecca Black recommended tabling the discussion until additional line revisions can be done. Denton Zeronas made the motion to table the discussion until additional lot line revisions can be drawn. Royce Lorentz provided the second. The motion passed following a roll call vote. Christian Laskey will speak with Graff Surveying to request 2 additional drawings for the lot.

Stormwater on Franklin Street: Gateway Engineers inspected several stormwater issues in the Borough. After extensive plan and deed research, it was found that the failing storm water infrastructure between Center and Franklin streets is the responsibility of Slippery Rock Borough.
