Mayor Longo led Council in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Borough Updates:

Discussion Items:

2024 MMO Pension Contributions: Angel Walker presented the 2024 MMO Contributions for the uniform and non-uniform pensions plans. Royce Lorentz made the motion to approve the 2024 MMO Pension Contributions. John Hicks provided the second. The motion passed unanimously following a roll call vote.

Resolution 476 – Mayor of the Year: John Hicks made the motion to nominate Mayor Longo for Mayor of the Year. Alex Tuten provided the second. The motion passed unanimously following a roll call vote.

2024 Meeting Schedule: The 2024 Council Meetings schedule has been proposed and reviewed. John Hicks made the motion to advertise the proposed 2024 meeting schedule. Royce Lorentz provided the second. The motion passed unanimously following a roll call vote.

Rebecca Myers: Rebecca Myers addressed council regarding single use bags. She stated that cities like Pittsburgh and Philadelphia have placed bans and restrictions on single use plastic bags. She would like Slippery Rock Borough to look at implementing an ordinance to ban and restrict single use plastics.

Bonnie Davis: Bonnie Davis addressed council asking about the controversy surrounding the flag. Rebecca Black responded that it was a noise complaint and allegations that Borough funds were being used to maintain the flag.

Councilperson's Remarks:

Alex Tuten commented on the importance of respecting freedom of speech on all sides. She congratulated Jennifer Ravert on being elected to council and she thanked Royce Lorentz for all he has done and continues to do for the Borough.

Royce Lorentz asked that the public get involved and provide their input as much as possible in order to create the most comprehensive plan for Slippery Rock.
